Federal Office

Northern New England has an aging population. This demographic shift is resulting in workforce constraints across the entire healthcare sector. Concurrently, patients are not able to access the right level of care at the right time.

• How will you address rural healthcare workforce constraints? How can you work to improve patient access to the appropriate level of care when a patient needs it?

Many of Dartmouth Health's patients rely on Medicare as their source of health insurance.

• If you are elected to the federal office you are seeking, what will you do to ensure that Medicare is available and that all seniors will be able to access the medical care they need?

New Hampshire
