

## Traveler Housing Tips for New Hampshire & Vermont

- Furnished: Ask the landlord exactly what is included in the rental. Do not assume what you see in the
  photos is what you will get. Does it include linens, kitchen supplies, cleaning supplies, access to a washer
  and dryer, etc.?
- 2. **Traveling with pets:** We're here to help you explore your options. Not all landlords in this area will rent to dogs, and some will consider indoor cats. If your dog is traveling with you, some landlords will allow a dog as long as a member of your family works from home..
- 3. **Utilities included:** Verify that heat, electric, and water are included in the monthly rent. Not all rentals will have A/C, WiFi, cable, or cellphone service. If they are important to you, ask. Always ask to confirm that there are not any other unexpected fees in your rental.
- 4. **Lease term:** Ask landlords if they would be willing to base it on your contract. That way if for any reason it is cancelled, you are not obligated to pay for the remainder of the stay. Most landlords will not offer casual month to month terms with no lease.
- 5. **Deposits:** In the State of NH it is only legal to ask for one month's rent as a refundable deposit. Landlords may not ask in advance for last month's rent. In the State of VT there is no law regarding deposits.
